CCTV cameras helped police to safeguard Sabarimala

This year the pilgrimage season has been under CCTV surveillance and this has helped the police in planning the security at Sabarimala accurately. On the route from Chalakkayam to Sannidhanam, there are 76 CCTV cameras were installed and in this 52 of them can rotate anywhere. The cameras can zoom minute and has made the job of police easier. Police have said that they have used 24 hi-tech bullet CCTV cameras.

The CCTV cameras have helped the police to control the crowd at Sannidhanam. The recording facility has also enabled them to retrieve visuals up to 60 days. Meanwhile, a team of police officers was deployed to look after the visuals for 24 hours.
